PRELIMINARY

***Citation and
commencement***

1. This Law may be cited as the Jigawa State University Kafin Hausa Law 2013 and shall come into operation on **13TH day of May, 2013.**

Interpretation

2. In this law:

“academic staff” means those members of staff whose role or primary duty is teaching and or research/extension;

“administrative staff” means those members of staff who are not members of academic staff;

“approved day” means the date on which the Law shall come into operation;

“the Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;

“the Council” means the Council of the University;

“the members of the University” means those persons or office holders described in the First Schedule;

“Faculty” means a Faculty of the University;

“Officers of the University” means those persons or office holders described in the Second Schedule;

“Governor” means the Governor of Jigawa State;

“House of Assembly” means the Jigawa State House of Assembly;

“Lecturer” means a person holding a full time appointment as a member of the teaching and or research staff of the university;

“Professor” means a person designated as a professor by the University in accordance with this Law or regulations made there under;

“Graduate” means a person on whom degree, other than honorary degree, has been conferred by the University;

“Property” includes rights, liability and obligations;

“Regulations” means regulations made by the University under the provisions of this Law;

“State” means Jigawa State of Nigeria;

“Student” means an undergraduate and any other person of such description as may be prescribed for the purpose of this definition;

“the Senate” means the Senate of the University;

“the Statutes” means the Statutes of the University enacted in pursuance to this Law;

“the University” means Jigawa State University;

“Congregation” means an assembly of members of the University as defined in the Sixth Schedule;

“Convocation” means an assembly of members of the University as defined by the Seventh Schedule.

ESTABLISHMENT, POWERS AND OBJECTS

- Establishment and Objects**
3. (1) There is hereby established in Jigawa State a University to be known as **JIGAWA STATE UNIVERSITY, KAFIN HAUSA** which shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal and which may sue and be sued in its corporate name.
- (2) The University shall draw inspiration from and be a beacon of light to all the people of Jigawa State and shall dedicate itself to the creation of better living conditions for the people. The University shall do this through the application of knowledge and skills generated.
- (3) The University shall have the following objectives to guide its principles and operations:

- a. to make higher education more accessible to the people of Jigawa State in an environment that reflects the religious and socio-cultural values of the society;
- b. to nurture quality graduates in all field of knowledge fully conscious of their history and duty to serve and empower the State, in particular and humanity, in general to face its many challenges, by infusing in them the positive values that will build their characters as future leaders;
- c. to recruit, develop and maintain highly qualified teaching staff that will be active in and renowned for research and commitment to teaching;
- d. to dedicate itself to challenging the normal way of solving societal problems by encouraging collaboration and innovative multi disciplinary research and seeking out old and new challenges that have been ignored;
- e. to establish and nurture relationships with individuals, organisations, government agencies as well as the private sector to enhance the educational, economic, religious and socio-cultural vitality of Jigawa State and the nation at large;
- f. to encourage the exploration of local technologies as well as stimulate innovation, adaptation and application of accessible and cost – effective technology solutions to societal problems of environmental degradation and desertification, low agricultural output, delivery of educational and health services to the rural populace along with water supply and housing

challenges amongst developmental challenges now and in the future;

- g. to creatively infuse activities that map all academic studies to their fields of practice or service by attachments, visitations and such other mechanisms as are deemed feasible so that all students in all disciplines benefits from practical field experience, mentoring and guidance from practitioners in their related fields of study;
- h. to equip all students with entrepreneurship education and skills, so as to empower them to be job creators capable of adding value to the economic of and exploiting the natural resources of Jigawa State, rather than job seekers upon graduation.

(4) The vision of the University is "To be a top class University that provides a stimulating teaching, learning and research environment in pursuit of solutions to societal problems".

(5) The Mission of the University should be "To produce graduates sound in character and learning, at under graduate and graduate levels, imbued with the spirit of service and dedicated to innovative applications of knowledge aimed at improving the lives of people within Jigawa State, the nation and humanity in general".

Powers of the University

4. (1). For the carrying out of the objects as specified in Section 3 the University shall have the power which ought to be

exercise with a fair autonomy, devoid of excessive and undue interference as follows:

- a) to establish such campuses, colleges, institutes, schools, centres, extramural departments and other teaching and research units as may from time to time be deemed necessary or desirable;
- b) to institute professorships, readerships, lectureships and any other posts and offices and make appointments thereto;
- c) to provide for the welfare and discipline of members of the University;
- d) to hold examinations and grant degrees, diplomas, certificates and other distinctions to persons who have pursued a course of study approved by the University and have satisfied other requirements as the University may lay down;
- e) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, medals, prizes, honorary degrees and other titles, distinctions, awards and other forms of honours;
- f) to subject to any limitation imposed by law, demand and receive from any student or any other person attending the University for the purposes of

instruction such fees as the University may from time to time determine;

- g) to acquire, hold, grant, charge or otherwise deal with or dispose of movable or immovable property;
- h) to accept gifts, legacies and donations, upon such terms and conditions as the University may from time to time approve;
- i) to enter into contracts, establish trusts, constitute as trustees, solely or jointly with any other person, and employ or act through agents;
- j) to erect, provide, equip and maintain libraries, laboratories, lecture halls and theatres, hall of residence, refectories, sport grounds, playing fields and other buildings or things (whether in the State or elsewhere) necessary and suitable or convenient for any of the objects of the University;
- k) to hold public lectures and undertake printing, and publishing of books for academic or commercial purposes;
- l) to subject to any limitations or conditions imposed by Law, invest any money not immediately required for expenditure, in securities authorised by Law for the investment of public funds;

- m) to borrow money, whether on interest or not upon such security as the Council may from time to time in its discretion determine, and may guarantee any loan, advances or credit facilities;
 - n) to make gifts for any charitable purpose and such other causes;
 - o) arrange for general welfare of children and spouses of members of staff;
 - p) to make Statutes and rules not inconsistent with the provisions of this Law for regulating the administration of the University
 - q) to admit students on formula 80% to the indigenes and 20% percent for other States and other Nationals;
 - r) to do all such acts or things, that are incidental to the forgoing powers as may advance the objects of the University;
- (2). Subject to this Law, the powers of the University shall be exercisable on behalf of the University by the Council or by Senate or in any other manner authorised by the Statute;

(3).The power of the University to establish campuses, colleges, institutes, centres and other instructional units shall be exercisable by Statute and not otherwise.

Visitor and Visitation 5. (1) There shall be a visitor for the University who shall be the Governor of the State.

(2) The Visitor shall as often as the circumstance may require, not less than once every five years, conduct a visitation of the University or direct that such a visitation be conducted by such persons as the Visitor may deem fit, and in respect of any of the affairs of the University.

(3) It shall be the duty of the bodies and persons comprising the University:-

a) to make available to the visitor and to any other person(s) conducting a visitation in pursuance of this section, such facilities and assistance as he or they may reasonably require for the purpose of a visitation; and

b) to give effect to any instruction consistent with the provisions of this Law, which may be given by the Visitor in consequence of a visitation.

Membership of the University

6. Membership of the University shall be open to persons and no discrimination shall be made or test imposed on the

ground of sex, religious belief, political views, racial or tribal origin, and place of birth or residence.

Principal Officers

7. (1) The following shall be the principal officers of the University whose appointment, discipline, removal and duties and powers are further specified in the Second Schedule;

- a) The Chancellor;
- b) The Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council;
- c) The Vice-Chancellor;
- d) Deputy Vice-Chancellor
- e) The Registrar;
- f) The Bursar;
- g) The University Librarian.

(2) The appointment of Principal Officers other than Chancellor and Vice Chancellor shall be strictly indigenou;

Chancellor

8(1) The Chancellor shall be the Head of the University and shall be appointed by the Visitor.

(2) The Chancellor shall hold office for five years from the date of his appointment, or until his resignation, whichever comes first, and shall be eligible for reappointment for another term only.

(3) The Chancellor shall, in relation to the University, take precedence before all other members of the University, and when he is present shall preside at all meetings of

Convocation held for the conferment of degrees, diplomas and certificates.

**Pro-Chancellor and
Chairman of the
Council**

9. There shall be a Pro-Chancellor who shall be appointed in accordance with Statute and shall, in relation to the University, take precedence before all other members of the University except the Chancellor and except the Vice-Chancellor when acting as Chairman of Congregation or Convocation, and shall, when present, be the Chairman at all meetings of the Council.

Vice-Chancellor

10. There shall be a Vice-Chancellor who shall be the Chief Executive and Academic Officer of the University and shall be the ex-officio Chairman of the Senate.

**Deputy-Vice-
Chancellors**

11. There shall be such number of Deputy Vice-Chancellors as the Council may decide.

Registrar

12. (1) There shall be a Registrar to be appointed by the Council for a fixed term of five years and be eligible for reappointment for another term of five years only.

(2) In addition to the duties imposed by this Law and the Statutes, the Registrar shall, under the Vice-Chancellor, be the Chief Administrative Officer of the University and shall in particular;

- (i) keep in safe custody all records of the University;

- (ii) arrange for the conduct of examinations;
- (iii) act as Secretary to and be responsible for executive action arising from decisions of the Council, the Senate, Congregation, Convocation and such other bodies as the statutes may prescribe or the Vice-Chancellor may direct; and
- (iv) serve as secretary to the council, the senate, congregation and convocation
- (v) assist the Vice-Chancellor in the general administration of the University.

Bursar 13. The Bursar shall be the Chief Financial Officer of the University and shall be subject to the direction of, and be responsible to the Vice -Chancellor.

University Librarian 14. The University Librarian shall be responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the implementation of the policy of the University with respect to the development and administration of the university library and the coordination of library services in the university and its faculties, departments, and other teaching and research units.

Appointment of Registrar, Bursar and University Librarian 15. The Officers aforesaid shall hold office for five years renewable for another five years only and only in accordance with the statutes of the University.

Scope of responsibilities 16. Any question as to the scope of the responsibilities of the aforesaid officers shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor.

Appointment of Members of Staff 17. Members of staff other than the principal officers enumerated in sections 11, 12, 13, and 14 shall be appointed by the Council in accordance with the procedure contained in the Eighth Schedule.

Admission of Students 18. Admission of students into the University shall be governed by the provisions of the Ninth Schedule in addition to such other procedure as the Council may, from time to time, provide through a Statute.

Establishment of the Council 19. There shall be constituted for the University in accordance with the provisions of this Law a body to be called "the Council of Jigawa State University".

Functions and Powers 20.(1)The Council shall be the governing body of the University with powers of general control and superintendence over the policy, finances, and property of the University.

(2)Without derogation from the generality of the powers conferred upon the Council by subsection (1), it is hereby declared that the Council shall have the following powers:

- a) to participate in the making, amendment or revocation of the Statutes of the University in accordance with the provisions of this Law;
- b) to govern, manage, and regulate the finances, accounts, investments, property, business and all affairs whatsoever of the University, and for that purpose:
 - i) to appoint bankers and any other officers or agents whom it deems expedient to appoint;
 - ii) cause proper books of accounts to be kept for all sums of monies received and expended by the University and for the assets and liabilities of the University so that such books give true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the University and explain its transaction;
 - iii) cause an annual report to be published by the University together with certified copies of the said accounts as audited;
- c) to borrow money on behalf of the University;
- d) to invest any money belonging to the University;

- e) to sell, buy, exchange, lease or accept lease of any real or personal property on behalf of the University;
- f) to provide the buildings, libraries, laboratories, premises, furniture, apparatus and other equipment needed to carry out the work of the University
- g) to enter into, vary, perform and cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
- h) to facilitate other Institutions or branches or departments thereof, and to recognise selected members thereof as teachers of the University, and to admit the selected members to any of the privileges of the University and to accept attendance at courses of study in such institutions, branches or departments thereof in place of such past attendance of course of study in the University and upon such terms and conditions and subjects to such regulations as may from time to time be determined by the University;
- i) to enter into agreements for the incorporation

in the University of any other institutions and for taking over its rights, property and liabilities, including members of staff;

j) to provide for the welfare of all persons employed by the University and the wives, widows and dependents of such persons including the payment of money, pensions or other payments and to subscribe to benevolent and other funds for the benefits of such persons;

k) to call for reports from the Senate on any matter relating to the functions and powers of the Senate;

l) to encourage and make provisions for research within the University;

m) to exercise all such powers as are or may be conferred on the Council by this Law or Statutes and to carry this Law and the Statutes into effect.

Delegation of Powers by the Council

21. The Council may delegate any of its powers or duties except powers relating to the making, or amending of Statutes, to the Chairman of the Council, Vice-Chancellor, Board of Governors of an Institute, other

unit of the University established under this Law or to any committee appointed by the Council and consisting:-

- a) of members of Council, or
- b) of one or more members of the Council and such other persons as the Council may appoint to the Committee.

Appointment of Chairman of the Council 22. The Visitor shall appoint a person, whether already a member of the Council or not, to be Chairman of the Council who shall hold office for a period of four years, but may be re-appointed for a further period of four years only.

Composition and proceedings of the Council 23. (1) Subject to the provisions of Section 21, the composition of the Council shall be as provided for in the Third Schedule.

- (2) The proceedings of the Council shall not be invalidated by reason of any vacancy or defect in the appointment of a member or a person not entitled to vote has taken part in the proceedings.

Removal of Members 24. (1) If it appears to the Council that a member of the Council (other than Pro-Chancellor, or the Vice-

Chance!(or) should be removed from office on the ground of misconduct or inability to perform his functions as such, the Council shall make a recommendation to that effect to the Visitor; the Visitor, after making such enquiries (if any) as he considers appropriate, may, by instrument in writing signed by him, remove the person.

- (2) The Visitor shall on signing an instrument of removal, in pursuance of this section, use his best endeavour to cause a copy of the instrument to be served to the person to whom it relates.

**Establishment of
the Senate**

25. (1) There shall be a Senate for the University, the composition of which shall be as provided for in the Fourth Schedule

- (2) The proceedings of the Senate shall not be invalidated by reason of any vacancy or defect in the appointment of a member or because a person not entitled to vote has taken part in the proceedings.

**Functions and
Powers**

26. (1) The Senate shall, subject to the provisions of this Law and the Schedules and subject to control by the Council in all matters affecting the finance of the University, manage the academic affairs of

the University, and shall, without derogation from the generality of the foregoing, have the following functions;

- a) to direct and regulate the admission of students and the teaching and instruction within the University and the examinations held by the University; provided that in the case of examinations for University degrees the Senate shall appoint internal and external examiners of high academic standing for every courses or group of courses forming part of the programme of studies for such degrees;
- b) to promote research within the University;
- c) to confer degrees (other than honorary degrees), diplomas, certificates, and other distinctions;
- d) to make, after receiving a report from the faculties concerned, all regulations for giving effect to the Statutes and regulations of the University relating to courses/programmes of studies and examinations;

e) to initiate and report to Council any amendment to Statutes;

f) to exercise and perform such other functions and powers as may be conferred upon it by the Statutes.

Withdrawal of Certificates

(2) Subject to a right of appeal from the decision of the Senate to the Council and from the decision of the Council to the Chancellor, the Senate shall have the power to deprive any person of any degree or diploma of the University which has been conferred upon him if after due enquiry he shall be shown to be guilty of dishonourable or scandalous conduct in the act of obtaining such a degree or diploma.

Faculties 27. There shall be such Faculties as may be determined by the Council.

Faculty Boards 28. (1) There shall be in each Faculty a Faculty Board for the University the composition of which shall be as provided in the Fifth Schedule shall:-

a) subject to the provisions of this Law, the Statutes and the direction of the Senate,

regulate the teaching and study of, and the conduct of examinations connected with the subjects assigned to such Faculty;

b) deal with any other matter referred to it by the Senate.

(2) A Faculty Board may deliberate on any matter affecting the work of the Faculty, and may make a report to the Senate thereon.

Membership

29. (1) The composition of each Faculty Board shall be determined by a Statute; which may include provision for membership to any Faculty Board of persons who are non-academic staff but are specially qualified to assist in the work of the Board;

(2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be a member of every Faculty Board.

Congregation

30. There shall be a body to be known as the Congregation, the constitution and function of which shall be as provided for in the Sixth Schedule.

Convocation

31. There shall be a body to be known as Convocation, the constitution and function of which shall be as provided for in the Seventh Schedule.

Institutes, colleges etc establishment and constitution 32. (1) There shall be such Institutes, Colleges, Schools, Centres and other Units as may be prescribed by Council.

(2) The functions and constitution of such Institutes, Colleges, Schools, Centres and other Units shall be prescribed by Council.

(3) For each Institute, College, School, Centre or Unit the Council shall provide for the constitutions and functions of a Board of Governors and Academic and Professional Boards.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Law, the Council may establish Special Units for special purposes within the University, other than Faculties, Institutes, Colleges or Schools, and the name, constitution and functions of any such units may be prescribed by Statute or by the Council

Statutes 33. Statutes made under the provisions of Section 4 may, subject to the provisions of this Law prescribe and regulate:

(a) the powers and duties of the principal officers and organs of the University, the composition

and constitution of such organs, and all other related matters;

- (b) the admission of students, their discipline and welfare and any other matter authorized or required by this Law.

Amendment of statutes

34. (i) The making and amendment of Statutes shall be carried out only by the Council and Senate or with the authority of the Council or the Senate.

(ii) Proposal for the making, amendment or revocation of Statutes may be initiated by either the Council or the Senate and shall require:

(a) approval at a meeting of the Senate by at least two thirds of members present and voting; and

(b) approval at a meeting of the Council by the votes of at least two thirds of the members present and voting.

(iii) Unless otherwise specified therein, a Statute shall come into force when approved jointly

by the Council and the Senate in accordance with sub-section (ii) and a Statute or an amendment thereto shall be published in the State Gazette.

Interpretation of Statutes

35. In the event of any doubt or dispute arising at any time regarding the meaning of any provisions of the Statutes, the matter may be referred to the Council, and the Council may seek such advice and make such decision thereon as it shall think fit and such decision shall be binding upon all organs, staff and students of the University.

Sources of fund

36. The funds and resources of the University shall consist of:

(1) such sums as may be provided by the State Government on quarterly basis as and when due, also reasonable amount of money shall be provided to cater for staff training, re-training and development;

(2) 2% of the total monthly share of allocation from the Federation Account to all the Local Government Councils in the State;

(3) any grant that may be given to the University from approved sources including but not limited

to States, Local Governments and the Government of the Federation, or national and international agencies, companies or individuals;

- (4) such sums as may be paid to the University by way of grants in aid, subsidies, donations, gifts, fees for services rendered, subscriptions, rents, interests and royalties;
- (5) such as may be derived from the sale of any property sold by or on behalf of the University.

Bank Accounts 37. All monies received on account of the University shall be paid into such bank as may be approved by the Council for the credit of the accounts of the University in accordance with the direction of the Council.

The monies or any portion thereof standing to the credit of any of the accounts of the University may, if the Council thinks fit, be invested in such securities as the Council may direct or be placed on deposit in such bank or banks as the Council may determine.

Audit 38. (1) The accounts of the University shall be audited and reported upon by a qualified public Auditor to be appointed by the Council in accordance with the provisions of the Tenth schedule.

- (2) As soon as the accounts of the University are audited, the Council shall forward to the Visitor a

copy of the statement of accounts together with a copy of any report or comments made by the Auditor.

- (3) The Council shall submit to the Visitor not later than 31st December, in each financial year an estimate of its expenditure and income during the next succeeding financial year.

MISCELLANEOUS

Contribution to Pension fund etc, 39. Provision may be made by the Council to authorize the University to contribute to any pension fund or other similar scheme for the benefit of members of the staff

Custody and Use of the Common seal 40. (1) The Registrar shall have custody of the common Seal of the University and shall be responsible for affixing the same to Documents.

- (2) The Common Seal of the University shall not be used except upon the direction of the Council and shall be authenticated in the manner prescribed by the Statutes and shall be officially and judicially noticed.

First Statutes

41. The Schedules to this Law shall, for all intent and purposes, constitute the first set of Statutes for the general administration of the University and shall not be amended, altered or repealed save in accordance with provisions of this Law.

Representation in Court

42. In any suit involving the University before a court of law it shall be represented by a legal practitioner to be appointed for that purpose or for general purposes by the Council.

Savings and Repeal

43. The Jigawa State University of Science and Technology Law (No. 10 of 2002) is hereby repealed.

44. (1) The Jigawa State College of Remedial and Advanced Studies Law 2012 is hereby repealed.

(2) All appointments made, contracts entered and any rights or obligations accrued under or pursuant to the repealed law under this section shall be deemed to have been made under this law.

FIRST SCHEDULE

MEMBERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The following persons shall be members of the University:

The Officers

The Members of the Council

The Members of Senate

The Members of Congregation

The Graduates

The Students

Such other persons as the Council may after consultation with the Senate, grant the status of members.

SECOND SCHEDULE

PRINCIPAL OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. The Principal Officers of the University shall be:

- a) The Chancellor;
- b) The Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council;
- c) The Vice-Chancellor;
- d) Deputy Vice-Chancellor
- e) The Registrar;
- f) The Bursar;
- g) The University Librarian.

2. **THE CHANCELLOR**

(1) The Chancellor shall be an eminent person of proven integrity and high repute to be appointed by the visitor, by an instrument published in the State Gazette, after due consultation with the State Executive Council.

(2) The Chancellor shall hold office for a period of five (5) years.

(3) If it appears to the visitor that the chancellor should be removed from office on the ground of misconduct or of inability to perform the functions of his office, the Visitor may by notice in the Gazette remove the Chancellor from office.

3. THE PRO – CHANCELLOR

(1) The Pro – Chancellor shall be a knowledgeable person versed in the administration of Universities or similar institutions and capable of inspiring confidence, and he shall be appointed by the Visitor, by an instrument published in the Gazette, after due consultation with the State Executive Council.

(2) The Pro – Chancellor shall hold office for a period of five (5) years

(3) If it appears to the visitor that the Pro-Chancellor should be removed from office on the ground of misconduct or of inability to perform the functions of his office, the Visitor may by notice in the Gazette remove the Pro – Chancellor from office.

4. THE VICE CHANCELLOR

(1) The Vice – Chancellor shall be a respected Senior Academician

(2) The first Vice – Chancellor shall be appointed by the Visitor.

(3) All subsequent Vice – Chancellors shall be appointed in accordance with the following procedures:

(4) The Chairman of Council shall by notice in the State Gazette and Journals of the University or other mass circulating media as he may determine declare the

position vacant and call nominations and applications

(5) A search panel of five persons comprising:

- i. One representative of Council, not being a member of Senate as Chairman;
- ii. Two members of Senate;
- iii. Two members of congregation, who shall be senior academics

The search team shall carry out consultation and obtain a list of qualified persons who may not otherwise apply.

(6) The lists of candidates obtained in (4) and (5) above, shall be submitted to the Senate for deliberations and voting for the purpose of ranking the candidates in order of preference.

(7) The Board of Selection shall thereafter short list a maximum of three (3) candidates and submit same to the Council

(8) The Board of selection shall be constituted as follows:-

- i. Two (2) members nominated by Council;
- ii. Two (2) members nominated by Senate;
- iii. The Pro-Chancellor shall serve as the Chairman of the Board of selection.
- iv. A member of the search panel shall not be appointed to the Board of Selection.

(9) The Council shall after due consideration of the report of the Board of Selection appoint the Vice-Chancellor subject to confirmation by the Visitor.

- (10) The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a single term of five years.
- (11) The appointment of pioneer Vice-Chancellor shall be for a period of five year and may be re-appointed for another five year term.
- (12) Subject to the provisions of this paragraph, the Vice-Chancellor shall hold office on such terms as to emoluments and otherwise as obtained in the Nigerian Universities Commission's Condition of Service for Vice Chancellors as may be determine by the Council.

5. THE DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR:

- (1) There shall be such number of Deputy Vice-Chancellors as the Council may from time to time, deem necessary for the proper administration of the University.
- (2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall forward to the Senate a list of two candidates for each post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor that is vacant.
- (3) The Senate shall select for each vacant post one candidate from each list forwarded to it under sub-section (2) of this section and forward his name to the Council for confirmation.

Where:-

- i. the Senate rejects the two candidates forwarded to it by the Vice-Chancellor under sub-section (2) of this section, the Vice-Chancellor shall submit another list.
- ii. the Council rejects the name sent to it under sub-section (3) of this

section, the Senate shall send the name of another candidate on the list forwarded to it by the Vice-Chancellor under section (2) of this section.

(4) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor shall:-

- a. assist the Vice-Chancellor in the performance of his functions;
- b. act in the place of the Vice-Chancellor when the post of the Vice-Chancellor is vacant or if the Vice-Chancellor is, for any reason, absent or unable to perform his functions as Vice-Chancellor; and
- c. perform such other functions as the Vice-Chancellor or the Council may, from time to time, assign to him.
- d. shall hold office for a period of two years beginning from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment, and
- e. may be re-appointed for a further period of two years.
- f. A person who has held office as Deputy Vice-Chancellor for a continuous period of four years shall not be eligible for appointment as Deputy Vice-Chancellor during the two years immediately following the end of that period.

THIRD SCHEDULE THE COUNCIL

1. The following persons shall be members of the Council, namely:

- (a) Pro-Chancellor and Chairman;
- (b) Vice-Chancellor;
- (c) Deputy Vice-Chancellor(s);
- (d) Two members elected by Senate from among members of that body;

- (e) One member elected by the Congregation from among members of that body;
 - (f) One member elected by the Jigawa State University Alumni Association from among members of that body;
 - (g) Three members representing a variety of interests groups; a woman and two other persons with proven integrity and qualification not below first degree level to be appointed by the visitor;
 - (h) The Permanent Secretary Ministry of Education;
 - (i) Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance in the State.
2. All members of the Council other than the ex-officio members shall hold office for four years or for such shorter period as the appointing person or bodies shall determine; except where otherwise provided all retiring members shall be eligible for re-appointment.
3. In addition to the powers conferred upon it by the Law, the Council shall have the following powers:-
- (a) to provide for the printing and publication of research and other works which may be issued by the University;
 - (b) to take into consideration, and, if the Council deems it proper so to do, to give effect to reports from the Senate on those matters upon which the Senate is authorized or required by Statute or the Law to make reports;
 - (c) to select a Seal, Arms and Mace for the University, and to have the sole use and custody of the Seal, and
 - (d) to do all such acts, or things, that are incidental to the foregoing powers, as may advance the objects of the University.

4. Any nominated member of Council may at any time resign his membership by sending his resignation in writing to the Secretary to the Council.
5. The Council shall meet at least three times during each year and at any time at the request of the Chairman of the Council or the Vice-Chancellor.
6. If requested in writing by at least half the members of the Council, the Chairman shall within fourteen days after such request call a meeting of the Council. The request shall specify the business which the said members wish to be considered at the meeting, and no business not so specified shall be transacted at the meeting.
7. The Registrar as Secretary to the Council shall send a notice to each member of the Council with a statement of the business to be transacted at any meeting of the Council so as to reach him at least seven days before the day fixed for the meeting.
8. Inadvertent omissions to send notices, inadvertent errors in addressing them and failures in the delivery thereof shall not invalidate the meeting of the Council thereby convened.
9.
 - (i) Each member of the Council shall have one vote. In the event of any equality of votes, the Chairman may exercise in addition, a casting vote.
 - (ii) Save as otherwise expressly provided, one-third including at least 2 external members shall form a quorum of a meeting of the Council.
 - (iii) Subject to the provisions of these Schedules and the Law, the Council

shall make, and may from time to time, alter such standing orders as it shall think fit with respect to its meetings and the meetings of any committee of the Council and the procedure thereof.

- (iv) Minutes of the meeting of the Council shall be kept and shall be open to the inspection of any member of the Council.

10. The Council shall provide for the safe custody of the Common Seal of the University, which shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two members and the Secretary of the Council and in pursuance of an express resolution of the Council.

11. (i) There shall be a Committee of the Council known as the Finance and General Purposes Committee, which shall consist of the Chairman of the Council, the Vice-Chancellor and not more than six members of the Council elected by the Council not less than two of whom shall be members of the Academic staff.

(ii) The Chairman of the Council or a member of the Committee nominated by the Chairman, the Vice-Chancellor and two other members shall form a quorum of the Committee.

12. The Finance and General Purposes Committee of the Council shall, subject to the general supervision of the Council, act for and on behalf of the Council in all matters and, in particular:

(a) shall authorize the collection and receipt of all dues for the University;

(b) shall supervise the collection and receipt of all debts, and monies due to the University;

- (c) shall direct the deposit and investment of all donations, subscription and other monies paid to the University;
 - (d) shall cause proper accounts to be kept and audited;
 - (e) shall deal with any urgent matter requiring decision during the intervals between meetings of the Council and shall report any such decision to the Council at its next meeting;
 - (f) shall examine draft annual estimates of revenue and expenditure of the University and make recommendations to the Council;
 - (g) shall consider and make recommendations to the Council on proposals for capital expenditure;
 - (h) may make recommendations to the Council concerning the conditions of employments of the staff of the University;
 - (i) may make recommendations to the Council concerning fees and other monies payable to the University; and
 - (j) shall perform such other duties as the Council may delegate to it.
13. The Chairman of the Council shall be Chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee.
14. (i) The Council may appoint such Committees as it thinks fit, and may delegate to any such Committees any powers or function which it is competent to perform other than its power to make Statutes.

- (ii) The Council may establish joint Committees of the Council and the Senate to which the Council may appoint members of the Council and Senate. The Council may delegate to any such joint Committees any powers or functions which it is competent to perform, other than the power to make Statutes.
- (iii) The Chairman of the Council and the Vice-Chancellor shall be ex-officio members of all Committees of the Council and all joint Committees of the Council and the Senate.

**FOURTH SCHEDULE
THE SENATE**

1. The Senate shall consist of the following persons:

- (i) (a) The Vice-Chancellor (Chairman);
- (b) The Deputy Vice-Chancellors;
- (c) All Deans of Faculties, Postgraduate School and Students Affairs;
- (d) All the Professors;
- (e) The Directors of the various Institutes, Colleges and Centres not below the ranks of Senior Lecturer;
- (f) The University Librarian;
- (g) The Heads of the Academic Departments;

- (h) Such lecturers, not being less than one tenth of the total number of non-elected members and not being below the rank of Senior Lecturer, elected by Congregation and at least one of whom shall come from each faculty; and
 - (ii) Such lecturers as mentioned in (h) above are to hold office for two years and be eligible for a second and final term of two years.
2. In addition to the powers conferred upon it by the Law the Senate shall have the following functions:
- (a) to appoint two members of the Senate to be members of the Council;
 - (b) to regulate, subject to the Law of the University, the admission of persons to courses of study of the University and their continuous stay at such courses;
 - (c) to appoint external and internal examiners on the recommendations of the Faculty Board concerned;
 - (d) to report to the Council on any academic matters;
 - (e) to discuss any matter relating to the University and to report its views to the Council;
 - (f) to report to the Council on any matter referred to it by the Council;
 - (g) to formulate, modify or revise schemes of the organisation of Faculties and Departments in relation to their respective subjects, also to make recommendations to the Council on the expediency of the establishment

at anytime of Faculties and Departments; or as to the expediency of the abolishing, combination or sub-division of any Faculties or Department;

- (h) to make regulations governing the conditions of the award of diplomas by any Faculty, Institute or other unit of the University;
 - (i) to appoint such Committee as it thinks fit, and
 - (j) to delegate to any Committee appointed or to any Faculty Board or other Board any powers which the Senate is competent to perform, other than the power to approve Statutes or to confer degrees.
3. The Senate shall meet at least twice during each Semester and at anytime at the request of the Vice-Chancellor or of one third of the members of the Senate.
 4. The vice-chancellor shall be the chairman at all meetings of the Senate when he is present; and in his absence such other member of the senate present at the meeting as the senate may appoint for that meeting shall be the chairman at the meeting.
 5. The quorum of Senate shall be one-quarter (or the nearest whole number less than one-quarter); and subject to paragraph (4) above the Senate may regulate its own procedure.
 6. At any meeting of the Senate the Vice-Chancellor, or other person presiding, shall have one vote but in the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall exercise in addition a casting vote.
 7. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Senate shall be kept, and shall be open to the inspection of any member of the Senate.

8. Inadvertent omissions to send notices, inadvertent errors in addressing them and failures in delivery thereof shall not invalidate the meeting of the Senate thereby convened.
9. Subject to the provisions of the Law or Statutes, the Senate may regulate the procedure of its meetings.

FIFTH SCHEDULE

FACULTIES AND FACULTY BOARDS

1. There shall be such faculties as may from time to time be determined by the Council.
3. The Faculty Board, in respect of each Faculty shall consist of the following members:
 - (a) The Vice-Chancellor
 - (b) The Dean of the Faculty
 - (c) The Heads, whether substantive or acting Head of Departments in the Faculty;
 - (d) Such other members of the academic staff holding permanent teaching or research posts and being members of that Faculty as the Senate may from time to time determine;
 - (e) Such other persons whether members of the Faculty or not as the Senate may, from time to time, on the recommendation of the Faculty Board, determine.

3. The Board of a Faculty shall have the following powers and functions:
 - (a) to regulate, subject to review by the Senate, the teaching and study of subjects in the Faculty;
 - (b) to constitute Boards of studies for separate subjects or groups of subjects;
 - (c) to consider the progress of students in the Faculty and to report to the Senate thereon;
 - (d) to recommend to the Senate examiners for appointment;
 - (e) to make recommendations to the Senate on regulations dealing with syllabuses, courses of study and examination for degrees, diplomas, certificates and other distinctions in the Faculty, or with any other matter relating to the work of the Faculty;
 - (f) to make recommendation to Senate for the award of degrees (other than honorary degrees), diplomas, certificates and other distinctions in the Faculty;
 - (g) to consider matters relating to the Faculty and to report thereon to the Senate, and to deal with any matters referred or delegated to it by the Senate.

4. The Board of each Faculty shall, at a meeting in the second semester of any academic year in which the term of office of the Dean expires, elect one of its members, being a Professor or serving or former Head of Department, for

- appointment by the Senate as Dean of the Faculty. The person so appointed shall act as Dean of the Faculty and Chairman of the Faculty Board.
5. The Dean shall hold office for a period of two years and be eligible for re-election for another period of two years.
 6. If the office of Dean becomes vacant for any cause before the expiration of his period of office, the Board of the Faculty shall elect one of its members, being a Professor or serving or former Head of Department, for appointment by the Senate as Dean of the Faculty, who shall hold office during the unexpired portion of the office of his predecessor.
 7. If a Dean is absent from his duties, the Deputy Dean shall act for him as Dean.
 8. The Board of a Faculty may appoint such committees as it thinks fit, and may delegate to any committee all or any of its powers, except the power of nominating the Dean. The Faculty Board shall report the appointment of any committee to Senate.
 9. Each Faculty Board shall have the right to discuss any matter relating to that Faculty, and to convey its views thereon to the Senate.
 10. Each Faculty Board shall prescribe the mode of conducting its own proceedings.
 11. Unless otherwise determined by the Board of a Faculty, the quorum of the Faculty Board shall be the Dean or Acting Dean and one-third of the membership of the Board.

SIXTH SCHEDULE

THE CONGREGATION

1. Congregation shall consist of the Officers of the University (other than the Chancellor and the Pro-Chancellor) and all the senior staff of the University who hold a degree or its equivalent from a recognized University for the purpose of this Statute. The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairman of Congregation.
2. The Registrar, as Secretary to Congregation, shall keep a register in which shall be entered the names of all members of Congregation.
3. The functions of Congregation shall be:
 - (a) to provide a forum for the discussion of any matter whatsoever affecting the overall well being of the University and to make recommendations from time to time to the Council or the Senate on such of these as it thinks fit;
 - (b) to receive information from time to time as to the state of the University from the Vice-Chancellor or such other persons as he may nominate;
 - (c) to nominate or elect members of the Council and the Senate as prescribed by the Statutes.
4. The Congregation may prescribe the mode of conducting its proceedings.

SEVENTH SCHEDULE

CONVOCATION

1. The Convocation shall consist of: -
 - (a) The officers of the University mentioned in the Second Schedule;
 - (b) All lecturers within the meaning of the Law; and
 - (c) All other persons whose names are registered in accordance with paragraph two below.

2. A person shall be entitled to have his name registered as a member of Convocation if: -
 - (a) he is either a graduate of the University or a person satisfying such requirements as may be prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph; and
 - (b) he applies for the registration of his name in the prescribed manner and pays the prescribed fees; and regulations shall provide for the establishment and maintenance of a register for the purposes of this paragraph and, subject of paragraph (3) below, may provide for the payment from time to time of further fees by persons whose names are on the register and for the removal from the register of the name of any person who fails to pay those fees.

3. The person responsible for maintaining the register shall, without the payment of any fees, ensure that the names of all persons who are for the time being members of convocation by virtue of paragraph (1)(a) or (b) above are entered and retained on the register.

4. A person who reasonably claims that he is entitled to have his name on the register shall be entitled to demand to inspect the register or a copy of the register at the principal offices of the University at all reasonable times.
5. The register shall, unless the contrary is proved, be sufficient evidence that any person named therein is, and that any person not named therein is not, a member of convocation; but for the purpose of ascertaining whether a particular person was such a member on a particular date, any entries in the deletions from the register made on or after that date shall be disregarded.
6. The quorum of convocation shall be one-third (or the whole members nearest to one-third of the total number of members of convocation, whichever is less).
7. The Vice-Chancellor shall be Chairman at all meetings of Convocation when he is present, and in his absence such other member as Convocation may appoint for that meeting shall be the Chairman at the meeting.
8. Convocation shall have such functions, in addition to the function of appointing a member of the Council, as may be provided by Statute.

EIGHTH SCHEDULE

MEMBERS OF STAFF

1. There shall be Appointments and Promotions Committee for the purpose of recommending to the Council the appointment of the Officers of the University other than the Chancellor, the Pro-Chancellor/Chairman and the Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor and of appointing or promoting all other members of the University staff who are classified by the Council as Senior Staff; provided that the Chairman of the Council shall be consulted on all appointments or promotions to the grade of Professor.

2. As may be provided under paragraph 8 the Appointments and Promotions Committee for the purposes of all appointments and promotions under paragraph 1 shall consist of the following persons:-
 - (a) the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Council when appointments of officers of the University are considered;
 - (b) the Vice-Chancellor;
 - (c) the Deputy Vice-Chancellors;
 - (d) two members of the Council not being members of the Senate, appointed by the Council;
 - (e) two members of the professoriate appointed by the Senate;
 - (f) the Directors, Deans or Principals concerned.
3. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the Senior Staff of the University the Council shall, except for good reason, cause the vacancy to be advertised.
4. The appointments of all members of staff shall be made on such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.
5. Subject to the provisions of this Law and to the terms of his appointments, no member of the Senior Staff shall be dismissed save by the decision of the Council for good cause and "Good Cause" means:-
 - (a) Conviction for any offence which the Council considers to be such as to

render the person concerned unfit for the discharge of the functions of his office; or

- (b) Any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold his office; or
- (c) Conduct of a scandalous or other disgraceful nature which the Council considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold office; or
- (d) Conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.

6. If it appears to the Council that there are reasons for believing that any person employed as a member of the academic, or administrative or technical staff of the university other than the Vice-Chancellor should be removed from his office or employment on the ground of misconduct or of inability to perform the functions of his office or employment the Council shall:-

- (i) give notice of those reasons to the person in question;
- (ii) afford him an opportunity of making representations in person on the matter to the Council; and
- (iii) If he or any three members of the Council so request within the period of one month beginning with the date of the notice make arrangements:-
 - (a) For a joint Committee of the Council and the Senate to investigate the matter and report on it to the Council; or

- (b) For a Committee of the Senate to investigate the matter, where it relates to any other member of the staff of the University, and report on it to the Senate and to the Council; and
 - (c) For the person in question to be afforded an opportunity of appearing before and being heard by the investigating Committee with respect to the matter; and if the Council, after considering the report of the investigating Committee, is satisfied that the person in question should be removed as aforesaid, the Council may so remove him by an instrument in writing signed on the directions of the Council.
7. (i) The Vice-Chancellor may, in a case of misconduct by a member of the staff which in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor is prejudicial to the interest of the University, suspend such member and any such suspension shall forthwith be reported to the Council.
- (ii) Any person suspended pursuant to sub-section (7)(i) above shall be on half pay and the Council shall before the expiration of a period of 3 months after the date of such suspension consider the case against the person and come to a decision as to:-
- (a) Whether to continue such person's suspension and if so on what terms (including the proportion of his entitlements to be paid to him);
 - (b) Whether to reinstate such person in which case the Council shall

restore his full emoluments to him with effect from the date of suspension;

- (c) Whether to take such lesser disciplinary action against such person (including the restoration of such proportion of his emolument that might have been withheld as the Council may determine; and in any case where the Council, pursuant to this section, decides to continue a person's suspension or decides to take further disciplinary action against a person, the Council shall before the expiration of a period of 3 months from such decision come to a final determination in respect of the case concerning any such person.

8. (i) It shall be the duty of the person by whom an instrument of removal is signed in pursuant of sub-section (7)(i) above to use his best endeavours to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person to whom it relates.

(ii) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall prevent the Council from making regulations for the discipline of other categories of staff and workers of the University as may be prescribed.

9. Any member of the staff who is dismissed under the terms of this schedule shall ipso facto be deprived of his rights and privileges.

10. Subject to the directions of the Vice-Chancellor, the Registrar may appoint and dismiss any member of the staff other than the senior staff after due process.

11. Any person dissatisfied with the decision of the investigation Committee and/or the Council in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of this statute, has the right to appeal against the decision of the Visitor and, where such an appeal is brought, the Visitor shall after causing such an inquiry to be made in the matter as he deems just, either confirm, set aside or modify it, in such a manner as he deems fair and just.

NINTH SCHEDULE

STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

1. Students shall be those persons receiving regular instructions in the University whether studying for a degree or other award.
2. The Council shall, after consultation with the Senate from time to time, determine the requirements (other than academic requirements) which must be fulfilled for admission as a student of the University.
3. The period of approved study for first degree to qualify a student to be examined for the degree shall not be less than eight, ten and twelve semesters in the case of four, five and six year degree programmes respectively provided that:
 - a. The Council may at the request of the Senate and for good cause amend the period of study.
4. Students and all other persons whatsoever attending the University for the purpose of instruction shall be subject to the disciplinary control of the University.
5. The names, constitutions, functions, privileges and other matters relating to students organisation shall be approved by the Vice-Chancellor or by any officer of the University authorized by the Vice-Chancellor to give such approval.

6. (i) Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to the Vice-Chancellor that any student of the University has been guilty of misconduct, the Vice-Chancellor may, without prejudice to any other disciplinary powers conferred on him by Statute or regulations direct:-
- (a) that the student shall not, during such period as may be specified in the directives, participate in such activities of the University or make use of such facilities of the University, as may be so specified, or
 - (b) that the activities of the student shall, during such period as may be specified in the directives, be restricted in such manner as may be specified; or
 - (c) that the student be rusticated for such period as may be specified the directives; or
 - (d) that the student be expelled from the University.
- (ii) Where a directive is given under sub-section (6)(a)(b)(c) and (d) above in respect of any student, the student may within the prescribed period and in the prescribed manner, appeal from the directive to the Council; and where such an appeal is brought, the Council shall, after causing such inquiry to be made into the matter as the Council considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it in such manner as the Council thinks fit.
- (a) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance of the last foregoing sub-session shall not affect the operation of the direction while the appeal is pending;

- (b) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate his powers under this section to a Disciplinary Board consisting of such members of the University as he may nominate.
7. (i) In the exercise of his responsibility for the discipline of students, the Vice-Chancellor shall have regard to the advice of a Committee consisting of a Deputy Vice-Chancellor as Chairman (or if no Deputy Vice-Chancellor has been appointed an ex-officio member of the Senate nominated by the Vice-Chancellor) and such person as the Senate may appoint as members;
- (ii) The procedure for the discipline of students other than students in the Faculties shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor after consulting the appropriate Board;
- (iii) Any rules or procedures for the discipline of students shall include, in the event of expulsion from the University, a right to appeal to the Council provided that this shall not include a right to appear personally before the Council.

TENTH SCHEDULE

AUDITORS

1. The Council shall from time to time appoint an Auditor or Auditors. Every such Auditor shall be a public accountant in active practice of his profession, but no such person shall be appointed auditor who is or any one whose partner is a member of Council or staff of the University. He shall hold office for three years shall be eligible for re-appointment and shall receive such remuneration as may be determined by the Council.

2. The Auditor or Auditors shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to the books, accounts and vouchers of the University and shall be entitled to require from the Officers of the University such information and explanations as may be deemed necessary by him or them for the audit of the University accounts.
3. Acceptance of office by an auditor shall be deemed to carry with it an undertaking by the Auditor to the Council that every certificate given by him or passing of accounts by him implies that he is satisfied by every reasonable means within his power of reach and after the exercise of due professional skills that the statements in the certificates are true and accurate; and that any accounts certified or passed by him are complete, true and accurate.
4. Both parties for good cause and upon giving notice in writing can terminate the appointment.

**A LAW TO AMEND THE JIGAWA STATE UNIVERSITY KAFIN HAUSA
LAW NO. 6, 2013**

ENACTED by the Jigawa State House of Assembly:

Date of Commencement (23rd December 2014)

1. Citation.

This Law may be cited as Jigawa State University Kafin Hausa (Amendment No. 2) Law.

2. Interpretation.

Principal Law' means Jigawa State University Kafin Hausa Law No. 6, 2013

3. Amendment of Section 3 (1) of the Principal Law.

Section 3 (1) is deleted and replaced as follows:

'There is established in Jigawa State a University to be known as **SULE LAMIDO UNIVERSITY KAFIN HAUSA** which shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal and which may sue and be sued in its corporate name'
